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## COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is ideal if you are a health care professional working in diabetes, and want to enhance your knowledge, understanding and competencies in clinical assessment, diagnoses and management of the condition. Typical students include dietitians, specialist children and young peoples' diabetes nurses, specialist teams in transitional care, psychologists, specialist registrars, podiatrists, school nurses, ward nurses, play therapists and youth workers. It has been developed to meet the advanced competencies for level 3 training (SPIN) in paediatric diabetes (2018), and will allow you to build on your skills of enquiry, reflection, problem solving, and critical thinking in relation to patients with diabetes, and how best to manage this.

It has been created by staff within the Children Young People Diabetes Care Teams across the country, and in collaboration between Birmingham City University, Birmingham Children's Hospital, Leeds Children's Hospital and University College London Hospital.

You can choose to study this as either a stand-alone module, or as part of the MSc in Advancing Diabetes Care.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To apply for this course, you must be a registered health care professional with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC), Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) or General Medical Council (GMC).

For unregistered professionals such as play therapists or youth workers please contact the course leader and we can consider your application accordingly.

## ASSESSMENT

You will be required to write an article for publication. The word count for this is flexible depending on the journal you have chosen to write the article for.

## FURTHER STUDY

If you'd like to continue your studies, you could complete other modules on the MSc in Advancing Diabetes Care, or consider the MSc in Advancing Clinical Practice.
